**RE: FORMULARY TIER CHANGES**

Dear Valued Culinary Provider,

Please be advised that effective July 1, 2012, the Culinary Health Fund will be implementing the standard Catalyst Formulary. This change will move approximately 80 different medications to a higher tier on the formulary. This will result in an increase in copay to the participant.

- Effective immediately, all Culinary participants filling prescriptions for the *first* time should be prescribed a preferred medication as indicated on Pages 2 through 4.
- Effective July 1, 2012, all Culinary participants with *existing* prescriptions for medications affected by this change, will need to obtain a new prescription for a preferred alternative or will have to pay the increased copay.

**Please transition your Culinary patients to a preferred alternative listed in the chart on Pages 2 through 4 prior to July 1, 2012 to ensure minimal cost impact to the participant.**
